KOICA & SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

About KOICA

The Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA) was founded as a government agency on April 1, 1991, to maximize the effectiveness of Korea's grant aid programs for developing countries by implementing the government's grant aid and technical cooperation programs.

In the past, development cooperation efforts were focused on meeting the Basic Human Needs (BHNs) of developing countries and on fostering their Human Resources Development (HRD).

However, the focus has now shifted to promoting sustainable development, strengthening partnerships with developing partners, and enhancing the local ownership of beneficiaries.

Additionally, global concerns such as the environment, poverty reduction, gender mainstreaming, and population have gained significant importance among donor countries.

Due to the continuously changing trends in development assistance efforts and practices, KOICA is striving to adapt to these changes by using its limited financial resources effectively on areas where Korea has a comparative advantage.


In particular, since Korea has the unique experience of developing from one of the poorest countries in the world to one of the most economically advanced, this know-how is an invaluable asset that helps KOICA to efficiently support the sustainable socioeconomic development of its partner countries.

Korea's ODA & Framework

Official Development Assistance (ODA) is composed of grants or concessional loans, which are provided to developing countries with the purpose of promoting economic development and welfare.

Korea's ODA is classified into three areas: 1) bilateral aid (grant aid & technical cooperation), 2) bilateral loans, and 3) financial subscriptions and contributions to international organizations (multilateral).

Bilateral aid is comprised of technical cooperation and various types of transfer (made in cash, goods or services) with no obligation for repayment, and is implemented by KOICA under the authority of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the Republic of Korea. Bilateral loans are provided on concessional terms under the name of the Economic Development Cooperation Fund (EDCF), implemented by the Export-Import Bank of Korea under the Ministry of Strategy and Finance. Multilateral assistance is delivered either as financial subscriptions or contributions to international organizations.



Korea's Experience and KOICA's Program for Human Resources Development

Human Resources Development (HRD) has been the most important factor in Korea's escape from vicious cycle of poverty and underdevelopment that had existed for many decades. With scarce natural resources, HRD played a vital role in modern Korea's development. Clearly, Korea has emerged as an exemplary showcase of national development powered by HRD.

From its own development experience, Korea came to fully recognize the significance of HRD, specifically in regard to Korea's collaboration with other developing countries. With much experience and know-how in HRD, Korea contributes greatly to the international community by sharing its unique development experience with other nations.

Since its establishment in 1991, KOICA supported a variety of international cooperation programs for HRD, mainly in project-type aid form, focusing on education and vocational training with a concentration in building a foundation for HRD.

The training and expertise-sharing programs help our partner countries build administrative and technical expertise in both the public and private sectors. In order to share experience at the grassroots level, under the name of World Friends Korea, KOICA dispatches Korea Overseas Volunteers to provide services in the fields such as education, regional development, computer science, health care and nursing. Approximately 7,806 volunteers have been dispatched to 57 countries thus far.

The training program provides opportunities to individuals from developing countries to gain first-hand knowledge of Korea's development experience. The purpose of the program is to enable the participants to apply what they learned for the development of their home country or local community. Since 1991, KOICA has offered 3,695 courses to 53,984 participants from 174 countries. There are a wide range of topics covered in the training program, including administration, economic development, science and technology, information and communication technology, agriculture and health. In order to meet the changing needs of partner countries, KOICA always strives to renovate and improve its HRD programs.

Types of KOICA Training Programs

KOICA offers five major types of training programs:

- Country Training Program
 Tailored programs that are specifically designed for an individual partner country
- Regular Training ProgramPrograms that are open to any interested partner countries
- Special Training Program
 Programs that are temporarily available owing to particular commitments of the Korean as well as partner governments

- Scholarship Program
 Master's degree programs offered to individuals from partner countries

KOICA's Scholarship Program

With a mission to nurture talented students from developing countries, KOICA invites high-caliber students from developing countries and helps them gain professional and systematic knowledge that will play a key role in their home country's development.

To accomplish this mission, KOICA has been operating master's degree courses with leading Korean universities in the fields of economics, trade, women's empowerment, rural development, etc.

In particular, this program has significantly strengthened the relationships between Korea and the students' home countries. Students, who have been given an opportunity to see Korea's experience in poverty reduction and socio-economic development, will gain a deeper understanding of Korea and contribute to the future social, political and economic ties between the two nations.

From 1997 to 2014, the program has assisted a total of 2,210 students. In addition, as of 2015 ,388 participants will participate in 19 master's degree programs at 16 Korean universities.

KOICA Scholarship Program is fully committed to the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and is determined to expand its efforts to nurture future talents from developing countries to promote their countries' sustainable economic growth and social development.

1. Program Title: KOICA-Yonsei Master's Degree Program in Global Health Security

2. Duration

- Stay duration: August 10, 2017 ~ January 9, 2019
 (17 months study in Korea)

 During 18 months in Yonsei University, students are strongly recommended to complete all required academics and graduation requirements.
- Academic duration: August 10, 2017 ~ February, 2019 (18 months)

 In accordance to the university regulations, the diploma will be issued in February 2019.
- 3. Degree: Master of Public Health, Global Health Security Prevention Program







The entire program is divided into three parts: Global Health Security Prevention Program, Global Health Security Detection Program, and Global Health Security Response Program. This year's program is the first program that focuses on infectious disease prevention and the trainees will learn relevant skills and knowledge to effectively prevent and manage infectious diseases.

4. Objectives

- To train public health professionals in the field of infectious diseases control to manage infectious diseases effectively and implant relevant health policies for the development of developing countries
- 2) To build partnership with developing countries for future overseas expansions of Korean public health institutions

- To share Korea's experience in infectious diseases and public health and disseminate Korean culture to developing countries

HOW TO APPLY

1. APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY

KOICA-Yonsei University Training Program applicants must satisfy all of the following requirements:

(1) Bachelor's degree by August 31, 2017

Education background in Public Health, Medical, Nursing, Science and other health-related majors are preferred.

(2) Not a Citizen of Korea

(3) Government Officials

More than 5 years in Ministry of Health and other health related government institution experiences are preferred. Since this year's program mainly focuses on Global Health Security, applicants currently in the field of infectious disease control or interested in the field are preferred.

(4) English Proficiency

Applicants must meet one of the English proficiency test minimum score requirements: TOEFL IBT 71, ICT 5.5, CBT 197 or higher.

English proficiency tests should have been taken within two years from the deadline of the online application.

English proficiency test report submission can be waived only for those who apply from a country where English proficiency test is not available. In this case, applicants are required to submit an official letter from the minister or governor of one's affiliation guaranteeing one's English proficiency equivalent to the required scores listed.

(5) Others

Be a citizen of the country which has a cooperative relationship with KOICA.

Be a government / municipality official or a researcher / instructor in state

institute working in his or her home country with a Bachelor's Degree or higher (Private sector employees are not eligible).

Have a good command of both spoken and written English to take classes conducted entirely in English and to be able to write academic reports and theses in English.

Be preferably under 40 years of age in good health, both physically and mentally, to complete the program.

- * Having Tuberculosis or any kind of contagious disease is regarded as a disqualifying condition for participating in this program.
- * Pregnancy is regarded as a disqualifying condition for participatingon in this program.
- Not be a person who has withdrawn from KOICA's training program.
- * Person belonging to the institution in which candidates submitted false documents and returned to his or her country arbitrarily in the middle of the program cannot apply.

Have not participated in KOICA's scholarship program or any of the Korean government's Scholarship Program previously (Master's degree program).

(1) Application Package Submission

- Prepare all required documents for your admission package and fill out the 'Document Checklist'. Check whether all information is correct.
- Submit the application package (including both Yonsei University and KOICA application forms and other required documents) to the regional KOICA office or Korean Embassy (if KOICA office is unavailable) by the submission date (April 12)
- Scanned copies are acceptable but original copies should be sent to Yonsei University before the interviews.
 - * Applicants who submit the scanned copies should send the original copies to Yonsei University personally. KOICA and the university do not pay postage costs for late submission of original copies.

(2) On-site Interview (KOICA)

 Participate in an on-site interview by KOICA regional office or Korean Embassy. If an applicant lives in a country where the KOICA regional office / Embassy does not exist or lives far from the capital city, he or she can be interviewed by phone after consulting with the KOICA regional office / Embassy.

(3) 1st Round: Document Screening (University)

- Applicants nominated by the regional KOICA office or Korean Embassy (if KOICA office is unavailable) as a result of on-site interview and have submitted their application packages are considered for document screening.
- Document screening will be processed by Yonsei University Application package as well as the on-site interview result will be thoroughly reviewed by Admission Committee of Yonsei University Graduate School of Public Health.
- Every component included in the application package such as the reputation of undergraduate school, undergraduate GPA, English proficiency, current affiliation, working experience will be evenly evaluated.
- The result for the 1st round selection will be announced to the applicants and KOICA respectively.

(4) 2nd Round: Interview (University)

- An opportunity for a phone / video interview will be given only to those who pass through the 1st selection document screening successfully.
- Details of the interview including the interviewee list will be sent to the regional KOICA offices and interview arrangements will be made respectively.
- Phone or video interview schedule will be notified individually by the regional KOICA offices or Korean Embassy with 2~3 day notice in advance.

(5) Medical Check-up (Local)

(Summary) The medical check-up results will identify the applicants' health conditions, and doctors belong to the coordinating agency will verify factors that hamper the completion of the scholarship program.

(Date of medical examination)

- The date of the medical check-up will be notified individually from the coordinating agency after passing the 2nd round successfully.
- The hospital reservation and related information will be notified to the applicants individually by e-mail from the coordinating agency. However, applicants who do not receive any notice until **June 5**th, **2017**, should contact the coordinating agency via e-mail or telephone above.
- Since the coordinating agency will provide guidance on medical check-up for those who passed the 2nd round by e-mail, you need to fill out the correct email address on the application form and check your e-mail in time.
- (Recipient) Applicants who successfully pass the 2nd round (limited to about 130% of capacity)
 - Applicants who successfully pass the 2nd round must receive an additional medical check-up. If you fail to take the examination within the given time, you will be disgualified.
 - Even though you are on the waiting list, you must receive the medical checkup.
- (Medical institution) The medical check-up will be carried out in the medical institution "designated by KOICA" located in the applicant's capital city.
 - * Examinations received individually are invalid and non-refundable.

- (Expenses) The coordinating agency designated by KOICA will cover all costs to the local medical institution directly, so the applicants should not make separate payments to the medical institution.
 - Please remember that transportation and accommodation fees will NOT be reimbursed.
 - KOICA will not pay for the treatment necessary after the examination.
- (Result notice) The local medical institution does not inform the participant of the results of the examination, but if the participants request to the coordinating Agency, they will send it to you directly.
 - You may be asked to receive re-examination by the coordinating agency to certain your medical condition.
- In case of re-examination, it must be done during the re-examination period. (The coordinating agency will inform individually for those who need re-examination.)
 - The results will be provided to KOICA Headquarters, KOICA overseas office as well as embassies, training institution, training support organization, and coordinating agency to progress application process.

Please read carefully before you apply

Changes in other natural and living environments may affect your health as leaving your home country. Among the trainees who have ever entered the country; their physical condition has fallen sharply, resulting in cases where they are hospitalized or had to return home earlier without being able to complete the program. In order to prevent such situation, we apply and judge the standard that does not interfere with the long-term study through the health screening when selecting trainees; we comprehensively judge the applicant's health eligibility based on the result of the medical examination.

Therefore, if you suffered from an illness in the past, or still have it (previous illness); you must state it in the Medical Questionnaire because there are some diseases that are exacerbated by the environment even if it is currently cured. If you do not report the exact details, you may not be able to claim your insurance or receive medical assistance. Besides, you might be sent back to your home country or end up returning your living expenses, travel expenses, etc. to us.

Korea may have higher medical costs than your home country. According to Korea's insurance system, at least 20% of medical expenses are mandatory deductibles by law; which often is covered by the participants themselves. Therefore, we would like to recommend for those who are under medical treatment due to illness, those who need regular medical examinations, and those who are receiving outpatient treatment for tooth problems such as cavities to consult with their doctors and apply to the Master's Degree Program after they are completely cured.

(6) Admission Notification

- Admission results will be notified to the regional KOICA offices or Korean Embassy. Registration instructions, course registration and other necessary steps will be guided to individuals.

d. Collaboration with Research Institutions

KOICA-Yonsei University Scholarship Program students are required to conduct a research project as their graduation requirement. In order to do so, students will be dispatched to research institutions during the program. During Pre-enrollment session, students will be provided with information about the research institutions and visit the institutions for more guidelines. After then, students and researchers in the institutions will be matched one by one. The matched students and researchers will conduct research together during the program and the researchers will be

responsible to take care of students' academic achievements. The research institutions are as follow:

1) Yonsei University College of Medicine Severance Biomedical Science Institute

Yonsei University College of Medicine Severance Biomedical Science Institute was built in 2010 to strengthen research capability and leap to the international biomedical science institute.

Research areas

- Redox Biology and Cell Signal Transduction
- Tumor Biology, Genomics and Bioinformatics
- Infectious & Immune Biology
- Diabetes, Metabolic biology and Autophagy
- Stem Cell and Cardiovascular Biology



2) Yonsei University College of Medicine Research Institute of Bacterial Resistance

Yonsei University College of Medicine Research Institute of Bacterial Resistance was established in 1998 to monitor the trends of antimicrobial resistance continuously and detect novel resistance from bacteria in Korea to support empirical selection of the most appropriate antimicrobial agents for the treatment of patients, determine the causes of the increasing prevalence of resistant bacteria to be able to improve guidelines for the prevention of emerging resistant bacterial infections. Also, the research institute aims to identify emergence of new resistant bacteria and establish laboratory methods for the detection, and determine in vitro and invov activities of existing antimicrobial agents, and provide necessary information for development of new antimicrobial agents.

Research areas

- Monitor the trends of resistant bacteria and determine the causes of emerging resistant bacteria
- Identify new resistance mechanisms and provide necessary information for the development of novel antimicrobial agents
- Evaluate new antimicrobial agents developed in Korea and as well as in foreign countries
- Investigate epidemiology of multidrug-resistant bacteria and perform molecular epidemiologic

3) Yonsei University College of Medicine Institute of Tropical Medicine

Yonsei University College of Medicine Institute of Tropical Medicine was established in 1968. Having more than 40 researchers in the institute, the research institute carries out various research regarding tropical medicine.

Research areas

 Studying parasitic diseases caused by protozoa, trematodes or nematodes with special reference to developing technologies in the diagnosis, treatment and control of these diseases

- Conducting research on systematics, ecology and the control of disease transmitting vectors, especially arthropods and snails
- Exchanging research results internationally
- Collaborating with other institutions in research and the training of research personnel concerning parasitic diseases and vectors of medical importance
- Developing efficient control measures against bacterial or viral infections

4) International Vaccine Institute (IVI)

International Vaccine Institute (IVI) is the only international organization in the world exclusively dedicated to discovering, developing and delivering vaccines for global health. Research in IVI covers the entire vaccine spectrum from discovery and preclinical development in our Seoul-based labs to clinical development at field sites in developing countries to generating scientific evidence on the need for vaccination in countries where vaccines are most needed.

IVI headquarters in Seoul have state-of-the are lab facilities, animal house, and research teams that include clinical immunology, process development, epidemiology, clinical & regulatory, biostatics & data management, and policy & economic research.



Outside of Seoul, IVI has a vlobal network of field sites in more than 20 countries in Asia, Afirca, and the Americas. IVI manages field sites in collaboration with regional and in-country partners. IVI also works with local partners to implement translational and field research projects, providint training and technical assistance.

5) International Tuberculosis Research Center

The International Tuberculosis Research Center promotes the development of new medicines for the prevention and cure of MDR-TB XDR-TB. The center also promotes clinical research, education and training of domestic and foreign TB experts, molecular microbiology research, immune pathology research, etc., at this point of time.

Research projects

- Extensively drug-resistant tuberculosis in South Korea: risk factors and treatment outcomes among patients at a tertiary referral hospital
- A double-blind, placebo-controlled Phase IIa study of the effect of metronidazole in MDR-TB patients
- The role of Neutrophils in the airways of patients with active pulmonary tuberculosis
- Evaluation of the risk of exposure to Mycobacterium tuberculosis in BCG-vaccinated individuals by an antigen-specific interferon-assay
- Tuberculosis Granulomas are Hypoxic in Guinea pigs, Rabbits, and Non-Human Primates
- Cross-resistance between aminoglycosides and capreomycin in a highly-treated MDR-TB population
- Reverse Hybridization Assays for Rapid Detection of Multi-drug Resistant M. tuberculosis Clinical Isolates

6) Severance Hospital Infection Control Center

Severance Hospital Infection Control Center is a unit in Severance Hospital. The Center aims to protect medical team and patients by effectively control hostpital infection.

7) Center for Disaster Relief Training and Research

Center for Disaster Relief Training and Research aims to protect the dignity of human beings who are damaged by disasters through humanitarian medical support and contributing to fostering professional disaster medical practitioners through scientific research and education.

Major activities

- Lectures on various disasters to understand natural and manmade disasters
- Simulation training to conduct simulation practice for giving first aid for each type of disaster and caring for patients
- Conduct hospital disaster drills for mass casualty incidents
- Establishing cooperative systems and information collection sytems with international agencies and government institutitons
- Organizing medical support teams with personnel in each sector such as nursing staff and medical administrators that can be dispatche immediately
- Forming a dispatch team for each period in the case of disaster and dealing with it systematically

4. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (TENTATIVE)

a. Site-visits during Summer and Winter Semesters

Yonsei University offers a chance to experience and learn about the history of outstanding public health growth of Korea by research institution visits during summer and winter semesters. The site-visits during the summer and winter semesters will be conducted as 2-week intensive course. It includes not only learning what each institution does in regard to manage infectious diseases but simulation to learn practical skills. The site-visit places include the following:

1) National Medical Center

National Medical Center, founded as the biggest hospital in Asia with the aid of Scandinavian countries on this battered, war-torn country after Korean War, became a special corporation on April 2nd in 2010 to perform responsibilities for the public as a national healthcare authority.

2) Korea Disaster Relief Team, Infectious Disease Center

Infectious Disease Center is run by Korea National Research Institute of Health (KNIH). First established in 1945, the KNIH has contributed to both public health and biomedical research in Korea during the past 70 years. With the experience with new infectious diseases such as MERS, KNIH are well prepared for the threats from any emerging infectious dseases. KNIH not only operates Infectious Disease Center but Korea Disaster Relief Team for disaster response.

3) Severance Hospital Infectious Disease Unit

Severance Hospital Infectious Disease Unit is the unit in Severance Hospital that controls infectious disease within the hospital.

4) Seoul Medical Center

Seoul Medical Center has a history of over 30 years. Seoul Medical Center aims to become a public medical institution that meets the social and cultural needs of the 21st century urban lifestyle in Seoul. As the leader of public health and welfare sector, the center stvice to take the public bio-medicine and health care

to the next level, the area in which the private sector is struggling, thereby providing more advanced medical services and contributing to the better life of the citizens.

5) International Vaccine Institute (IVI)

International Vaccine Institute (IVI) is the only international organization in the world exclusively dedicated to discovering, developing and delivering vaccines for global health. Research in IVI covers the entire vaccine spectrum from discovery and preclinical development in our Seoul-based labs to clinical development at field sites in developing countries to generating scientific evidence on the need for vaccination in countries where vaccines are most needed.

6) Korea Support Center for Foreigners

At this point of time where foreigners visit Korea for various reasons more than before, the importance of foreigners' dignity and welfare has been an important issue to Korean society. Korea Support Center for Foreigners aims to support foreigners in the areas of labor, health, diseases, etc. to satisfy their living and guarantee basic dignity.

b. Cultural Events

Yonsei University Graduate School of Public Health offers various kinds of cultural events as below;

Student Festival is held every spring and fall semester which offers fun and exciting experience of Korean festival culture.

2) Graduate School of Public Health Workshop



2. ACCOMMODATION

Yonsei University strives to help the students enjoy the best of their residential life in Korea by ensuring security and living convenience. Chejung Haksa is located a few feet from the main building of Graduate School of Public Health and is divided into two buildings – Ebison House and Student Dormitory. ➤ Restaurant (2nd floor, Administrative Building)

The restaurant is located on the 2nd floor of the building and open to everyone. The restaurant provides different menu everyday including vegetarian and less sugar meal. Beside the restaurant, there is a cafeteria that sells coffee, drinks and snacks.

➤ Woori Bank ATM (2nd floor, Administrative Building)

Students are recommended to open a bank account at a nearby bank or campus bank upon arrival. Woori Bank ATM is located in the Administrative building and the bank is in the Severance Hospital, which is at the back of the Administrative building.

▶Library (3rd floor, Administrative Building)

The library is open to all students of the Graduate School of Public Health and is located on the 3rd floor of the building. It provides not only wide range of books and study tables but computers for internet searching.

➤ Lecture Room (2nd and 3rd floor, Administrative Building)

The lecture rooms are located on the 2nd and 3rd floor of the building. A computer, microphone, projector and air conditioner are placed in each room.

Student Union Building

Student Union Building is built in ferroconcrete ramenjo structure with freecast concrete outer walls, a modernized edifice of Christian Gothic Style. The Student Union Building hosts some of the most central facilities on campus including the Office of Student Affairs and Service, Student Association, Muak Theaters, Vocal practice rooms, student cafeteria, post office, bookstore, stationery store and more.

➤ Student Cafeteria (1st floor, Student Union Building)

Student cafeteria serves Korean traditional and international dishes 3 times a day (breakfast, lunch, dinner) as well as Korean snacks (Kimbab, Ramen, etc).

▶Convenience Store (1st floor, Student Union Building)

Snacks, stationery supplies and personal care goods are available with a cozy lounge for a study break and relaxation.

➤ Health Center (2nd floor, Student Union Building)

The Health Center is on the 2nd floor of the building. It provides medication for minor illness and injuries. There is nominal fee for purchase of medication.

➤ Bookstore (B1 floor, Student Union Building)

Students are able to purchase textbooks that are needed in class at the bookstore, located on the B1 floor of Student Union Building. It is a good idea to ask your professors which books are absolutely essential for class.

➤ Woori Bank (B1 floor, Student Union Building)

A branch of Woori Bank is located inside Student Union Building.

Other Student Activities

➤Global Lounge

Build in 2002, Global Lounge in front of the Student Union Building is a special place having students interested in international broadcasting and news from all over the places. Some of the students organize online meeting. Language exchange program and buddy program are also active among students.

≻Central Library

Central Library represents Yonsei's mission and responsibility towards education and is the source of academic development and cultural creativity. The library has 5 floors above ground with a roof floor and one basement floor. It is the biggest civil stone architecture in Korea. The computer system, cooling and heating system and other equipment are provided inside the library. In 2010, the library went through 6 months of renovations in air conditioning, heating and ventilation systems, creating a fresher environment, expanding pathways, and upgrading IT environments and providing more community facilities.

b. General Student Service

➤ Mentor Program

Mentor Program is offered to assist international students to adjust into their new environment at Yonsei University Graduate School of Public Health and Korea. Students will be dispatched to research institutions during their stay and each student will be matched to a mentor of the designated institution. Mentors will be responsible for helping the students to cope with cultural and academic issues.

> ID Card

All degree program students will get an ID card for entering school gates, library, etc. This can be used as Woori bank check card as will. Students have to fill in an application form for an ID card with the help of the program staff and it takes 7~10 days to issue it.

➤ Computer & Internet access

Due to security issue, internet access is not provided by the university. Students are advised to use computers in the library for research and information searching. Students are required to log onto the computer using the given ID and password.

c. How to Get to Yonsei University Graduate School of Public Health

Yonsei University is located in Sinchon, about 6km off west of central Seoul and neighboring with 3 universities. Below is the map to the school and information on the nearest subway station.

➤ Line 2 Sinchon (15 mins walk)

- At the exit #3, walk along the road between Mc Donalds and A Twosome Place until the road ends (around 5 minutes).
- You can find the gate Yonsei University Main Entrance and Severance Hospital right next to the main entrance.
- Follow the Severance Hospital route and you can find the College of Medicine Building which is connected to the Administrative Building of Graduate School of Public Health.

PART VI

SUPPORT SERVICE

1. TRAVEL TO KOREA

KOICA arranges and pays for the participant to travel to and from Korea. The participant is to travel by the most direct route between Incheon International Airport and a main international airport in the participant's home country. KOICA will cover economy class, round-trip airfare.

If a participant wants to change the flight itineraries, they should pay the additional airfare. The participant is responsible for the issuance of an appropriate visa (which must be **the 'Study Abroad Visa [D-2])** necessary for this Scholarship Program. Should the participant be unable to get the appropriate visa before the date of entrance, KOICA is unable to provide any assistance and, if it proves necessary, participants may have to return to their respective countries to get the visa issued at their own expense.

2. EXPENSES FOR STUDY AND LIVING

The following expenses will be covered by KOICA during the participant's stay in Korea.

- 1) Tuition fee
- 2) Accommodation sharing a room basis (mainly the dormitory of a training institute)
- 3) Living & Meal allowance KRW 999,000 per month (this includes meal, books and study supplies if needed.)
- 4) A medical check-up in the following year(TBD)
- 5) New group injury insurance, etc.

In addition, participants may be invited to a special event organized by KOICA with the aim of promoting friendship among each other and understanding about Korea during the program.

3. INSURANCE

- · Participants who have entered Korea have been covered by "New group injury insurance" policy in case of illness or accident.
 - * The insurance coverage period is from the time of arrival in Korea to the time of departure.
 - * We encourage you to read about the coverage of insurance and deductibles carefully.
- KOICA is encouraging the participants to get National Health Insurance, which can reduce the deductibles by up to 80%.
- Medical expenses may be expensive due to the obligation to pay these deductibles.
- · Chronic disease (medical expenses for previous illness; high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, etc.) pregnancy, and mental illness will not be reimbursed.

During the program, participants will be covered by the "New group accident insurance." The insurance covers expenses for medical treatment and hospital care caused by diseases or accidents within the scope and limit of insurance coverage. Participants should first pay by themselves and then be reimbursed for the expenses later, on the condition that the case falls under the coverage of the insurance.

According to Korea's insurance system, at least 20% of medical expenses are mandatory deductibles by law; which must be covered by the participants themselves. Therefore, we would like to recommend for those who are under medical treatment due to illness, those who need regular medical examinations, and those who are receiving outpatient treatment for tooth problems such as cavities to consult with their doctors and apply to the Master's Degree Program after they are completely cured.

- National Health Insurance

According to Korea's insurance system, at least 20% of medical expenses must be paid by participants as mandatory deductibles by law. KOICA is encouraging the participants to get National Health Insurance, which can reduce the deductibles by up to 80%. If you have an illness that you have suffered in the past, or still ill (previous illness), you are recommended to join the National Health Insurance. If you are not covered by national health insurance, high medical costs may arise.

□ Dentistry

- Korean medical expenses of dental system diseases are very expensive
- Medical expenses for dental diseases are not reimbursed

Korean medical expenses of dental system diseases are very expensive. However, dental treatment costs are usually not covered by insurance and often exceed the cost of living. Therefore, it is recommended that you check your tooth condition beforehand and finish both tooth check-up and medical treatment before entering Korea.

** For dental care, no costs are covered by KOICA or "New group accident insurance."

PART VII

REGULATIONS

1. ACADEMIC REGULATION

a. Attendance and Absenteeism

- Students are expected to attend all of the classes he / she has registered for each semester. <u>Any student who, without good reason, has failed to attend class</u> <u>for at least one-third of the total classes shall be prohibited from sitting for the exam.</u>
- 2. In the event a student will be absent for any of the reasons below, the student must notify the appropriate department, faculty, and dean and get approval in advance:
 - Death of an immediate family member (grandparents, parents, siblings) or equivalent circumstance
 - Academic planning, field-trips, on-location training, etc.
 - Participation in seminars or conferences (including international ones) as approved by the Graduate School Dean
 - Other events as approved by the Graduate School Dean
- 3. In the event of student illness or emergency situations, students who will be absent for less than seven days (including holidays and weekend days) need to submit written notification of such absence to the Graduate School Dean. For absences longer than seven days, students must submit a written diagnosis by a physician.

b. Must reside in a dormitory

 Students must reside in Ebison House of Chejung Haksa Dormitry unless there is no vacancy in the dormitory. <u>All rooms are single occupant</u>. If there is no vacancy in the dormitory, Yonsei University and KOICA will arrange alternative accommodations.

c. Must reside abide by dormitory regulations

- Ebison House has very strict dormitory regulations and all students must abide by them.
- A student who violates dormitory regulations will be evicted from the dormitory and he / she must return to her country immediately.

d. Light meals can be cooked in the room

- Heating stove, fridge and sink are installed in the room and light meals can be cooked. .

e. Examinations and Grade Evaluations

1) Minimum Grade Point Average Requirement

- Anything below GPA 1.7 will not be counted as credit award.

2) Regular Exams and Make-up Exams

- Regular Exams: Mid-term (8th week), Final (End of semester)
- Make-up Exams: In the event a student cannot sit for an exam due to military service, illness, or any other emergency, the student must notify the faculty before the test date, and obtain the approval from academic director and program director to sit for the exam at another time.

3) Qualifications to Sit for an Exam

 Any student who, without good reason, has failed to attend class for at least onethird of the total classes shall be prohibited from sitting for the exam. In the event of illness or emergency situations, students need to provide a written explanation of their absence.

4) Scholastic Performance Evaluation Method

Scholastic performance will be based on GPA 4.3 for each course registered.
 Grades will be based on classroom performance (presentations, attendance) and test performance (mid-term and final exams).

2. PARTICIPANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Participants are required

- to take up the scholarship in the academic year for which it is offered (deferral is not allowed).
- to follow the training program to the best of their ability and abide by the rules of the training institute and KOICA.
- to reside in the accommodation designated by the training institute for the duration of the course except for holidays or temporary leave.
- to maintain an appropriate study load and achieve satisfactory academic progress for the course. If the participant fails to attain certain grades required by the university, his or her status as a KOICA program participant may be suspended.
- to participate in all activities associated with the approved course of study including all lectures and tutorials, submit all work required for the course and sit for examinations unless approved otherwise by the training institute in advance.
- to notify the training institute in advance and get an approval for temporary leave.
- to advise KOICA and the training institute of any personal or family circumstances such as health problems or family problems which may seriously affect their study.
- to refrain from engaging in political activities or any form of employment for profit or gain.
- to agree to KOICA collecting information concerning them and passing that information onto other relevant parties, if necessary.
- to return to their home country upon completion of their training program.
- not to extend the length of their training program or stay for personal convenience;
 neither KOICA nor the university will provide any assistance and be responsible for the extension of their stay.

3. WITHDRAWALS

- In principle, a participant is not allowed to withdraw from the course at his or her own option once the course starts.
- A participant may withdraw with valid personal or home country's reasons (such as health or work issues) when acceptable to KOICA.
- In this case, he / she is not allowed to re-apply for KOICA's scholarship program for the next two years after the withdrawal.
- If a participant fails to attain certain grades required by the training institute, he or she may be forced to withdraw and return home upon withdrawal.

In this case, he / she is not allowed to re-apply for KOICA's scholarship program.

- A participant who has withdrawn is not allowed to re-apply for KOICA's scholarship program for the next two years after the withdrawal.
- The participant who withdraws must return to the training institute the living allowance he or she has already received for the remaining period from the date of departure from Korea.

4. TEMPORARY LEAVE

- Participants can take a temporary leave **during the school vacation** (to the participants' home country or for a trip abroad) on the condition that the trip does not affect their schoolwork and as long as they notify the university in advance.
- KOICA and the university will not pay airfare for the trip and his or her living allowance will be suspended from the day of departure to the day of return during temporary leave.
- If the participant is found to have made an unreported temporary visit to his or her home country or traveled to other countries or made a trip despite the university's disapproval, he or she may be suspended from the KOICA scholarship.

5. ACCOMPANYING OR INVITING FAMILY

- As KOICA's Scholarship Program is a very intensive program which requires full commitment and concentrated effort for study, participants CAN NOT bring any family members.
- KOICA does not provide any financial or other administrative support for the dependents of the participants.
- If a participant invites family members within the duration of one month, one must take a full responsibility related to their family members travel to and stay in Korea including administrative and financial support as well as legal matters in Korea. The participant is required to sign and submit the Written Pledge with supporting documents by acknowledging their responsibility and conditions of bringing their family members in Korea in advance. A copy of the Written Pledge is available at GMPA Office.

6. OTHERS

- KOICA will assume any responsibility only within the limit and scope of the insurance for participants.
- KOICA is not liable for any damage or loss of the participant's personal property.
- KOICA will not assume any responsibility for illness, injury, or death of the participants arising from extracurricular activities, willful misconduct, or undisclosed pre-existing medical conditions.
- If the participants break any of the rules of KOICA and the training institute during their stay in Korea, their status as a KOICA program participant may be suspended.
